SOUTHINGTON, Conn. (June 25, 2012) — Central Connecticut Senior Health Services recently received a generous \$1,000 grant from the Community Partner Program at Wells Fargo Foundation. The funds will be used to enhance senior services throughout this community.

Central Connecticut Senior Health Services is a not-for-profit integrated healthcare system. Its primary mission is to enhance the health and well-being of senior citizens throughout Central Connecticut. Its skilled nursing, long-term care and short-term rehabilitation communities include Jerome Home in New Britain, and Southington Care Center. Assisted living communities include The Orchards at Southington and Mulberry Gardens of Southington, a community specializing in memory care. The newest additions to its family are Mulberry Gardens at Marian Heights Adult Day Center, and Arbor Rose, an independent and assisted living community with studio, one and two-bedroom apartments, as well as twelve apartments within a specialized memory care neighborhood. Both are located in New Britain. The Connecticut Center for Healthy Aging acts as a resource center for older adults and their caregivers that provides mobile assessments referral guidance on a myriad of aging issues.
